Lincoln Leadership Final Project Guidelines

Purpose:

- To create a persuasive argument FOR and AGAINST cell phone usage in schools that will be presented to the administration of LHS
- To create an interactive display of how the current generation is unique, focusing on social media and public service

Grading:

- This will count as both a 30 point project for 4th quarter AND 20% of your final exam
- The 30 points will be determined as follows:
 - 10 points PRO argument

- In this part of the assignment you will give reasons for both having phones in school and a policy that supports that AND for having phones censored in school and a policy supporting that decision
- These will be given as a collective unit to administration to see how well your policies would be received in a real world situation
- Generational Differences Presentation
 - It was clear during our discussion that you are aware there are differences, both positive and negative, between your generation and the ones that came before
 - In this part of the assignment you will produce an interactive presentation (yes, that is very open ended) that shows why your generation is unique and should be looked at as such
 - Include information from the videos shown in class and research done on your own
 - Presentation should include the aspects of the rubric listed above, but is NOT just a paper. It is a way to show the people around you in the school, the district, and the community, why your generation should be respected and listened to. Why are you unique? Why is this generation special?
 - You must include both positive and negative aspects of your generation
 - Possible options for presentation include, but are not limited to: power point, google slide show, youtube video, song or rap, interview montage, comic book/strip, etc
